

Majors in this Career Community

EXPLORATORY MAJOR

If you know this career community is the right fit for you but you're unsure of your major, choose the **business and accounting exploratory major** to get started in the right direction. Your first 15 credit hours are applicable to all majors within this career community, and you'll get the experience to know which major is right for you.

ACCOUNTING

You'll get a solid foundation in accounting theory so you can specialize in public or corporate accounting. You'll be qualified for jobs in tax accounting, governmental accounting, industrial/cost accounting, not-for-profit accounting and accounting for small business. After completing specific coursework – available via the traditional classroom or fully online – you may be eligible to take the certified public accountant exam and certified management accountant exam. You also can use the associate degree as a foundation to pursue bachelor's and master's degrees.

Accounting services for health administration major

When you work primarily in the area of hospital finance and accounting, you'll be well-prepared with additional coursework in medical terminology, the basics of health care delivery systems, the complex world of reimbursements and insurance, and the legal aspects of the medical profession.

Certified public accountant major

A certified public accountant (CPA) is a leader with the ability to provide a wide variety of client services, including auditing, tax preparation and planning, financial statement preparation and consulting. CPAs also work for companies, governmental entities and not-for-profit entities. With this major, you're starting your journey to becoming a licensed CPA.

Computer information major (accounting analytics)

You'll get a foundation in accounting theory and related business along with a highly developed information technology competency. You'll learn a number of the most widely used software applications and understand the basics of data analytics and information technology as used in accounting.

Corporate major

You'll get a solid foundation in accounting theory to prepare you for corporate accounting jobs in financial information preparation, reporting, and analysis or cost accounting; governmental accounting; not-for-profit accounting; and accounting for partnerships or sole proprietorships. With this major, you're starting your journey to becoming a Certified Management Accountant (CMA).

Forensic major

Along with a foundation in accounting theory, you'll get detailed knowledge of types of fraud, fraud prevention and fraud detection. The curriculum emphasizes design of effective internal control systems, monitoring compliance with those systems, and gathering and documenting forensic evidence when fraud has occurred or is suspected. You'll learn many of the requirements and monitoring and reporting provisions of the Sarbanes-Oxley Act.

Tax major

Constant tax code changes have created a need for corporate business and accounting firm employees knowledgeable in accounting, business transactions and tax law and able to convert that know-how into tax compliance and planning. With this major you can sit for Enrolled Agent exam.

You'll be well-versed in the finance areas that today's business environment demands. You'll gain the knowledge and skills needed to add wealth and value to your employer as you take on increasing responsibility within the corporate treasury function or personal finance and planning. This degree is a stepping stone to a career as a Certified Financial Planner (CFP) or Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA).

BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

In today's business world, companies are looking for managers who understand technology, can adapt quickly to change, work well in teams, skillfully motivate employees and realize the importance of satisfying customers. As a business management graduate, you'll be able to deliver all of this and more.

Finance major

Along with gaining business management skills, you'll understand a financial plan and have a working knowledge of the various investments.

Health services major

Health care is one of the fastest-changing fields in the U.S. today. This major blends our management program with a basic knowledge of the health care industry, anatomy, physiology, insurance and medical terminology.

Human resources major

You'll be able to deliver the skills from our management program and the more specialized knowledge involved in talent management, succession planning, diversity awareness and corporate culture development.

Entrepreneurship major

The entrepreneurship major equips students with the knowledge, skills and mindset to start, manage and grow ventures. Courses cover business planning, finance, marketing, innovation, leadership and strategic management, preparing students for challenges in starting businesses, working in startups or pursuing roles in established organizations.

KSU Stark BBA degree

Because Stark State recognizes the value of education beyond the associate degree, Stark State students can complete this special option in business management technology to receive an associate degree, then take an additional 49 credit hours of degree requirements through Kent State at Stark to earn a bachelor of business administration degree.

Marketing professionals determine the demand for goods offered by a business and its competitors while identifying potential customers. You'll also work with advertising and sales managers to promote products and services to attract potential customers.
